Writing the story map is your chance to clarify and solidify what you know about the book, so be sure that the information in your story map comes from your own head, **not** from what others may have written about the characters or plot on the internet or elsewhere.

While you are reading, I will also be making it through my book list for the summer! Among other titles, I am looking forward to reading Tolkien's *The Silmarillion* and *Unfinished Tales from Numenor and Middle Earth*. I will be thinking of you as I read, and looking forward to finding out more of the "backstory" for *Lord of the Rings*. In the meantime, I pray that you will find joy in loving and serving your families over the next few months, and I'll look forward to seeing you in September, if not before!
