March 23

Payment due: February 11

Pay with a credit card through the parent portal on Jupiter. You may also bring cash or a check to the school office

SAT SCHOOL DAY DETAILS:

Test: SAT test, without essay

Cost: \$55; Income eligible reduced fee: \$8 (See below for details)

Date/Time/Place: March 23, 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Location: to be determined

Bring to test: Two No. 2 pencils, calculator (may be graphing calculator), water, snacks

Scores available: April 15

Practice: Students can access free, personalized SAT practice at <https://www.khanacademy.org/sat>

Payment due date: February 11. Please bring cash or check to the school office or pay with a credit card through the parent portal in Jupiter

This test day is for juniors only, who are automatically registered as it is a graduation requirement. Juniors (and all high school students) are also welcome to take the test during one of the national Saturday test sittings. For dates and testing sites, go to:

Sophomores will not be permitted to miss classroom instruction to take the SAT test during the school day. Their participation will be mandatory during next year’s SAT School Day.
