**The Oaks will offer the official CollegeBoard SAT test during the school day**

**March 3, 2021**

**Registration deadline: February 12, 2021**

**Bring payment and form (below) to school office**

Many Oaks students have been frustrated this year with numerous SAT test cancellations due to the pandemic. Since the SAT test is an Oaks graduation requirement, we will begin this year to annually host an official SAT test midweek on our campus, called SAT School Day. We believe this will serve our families for its convenience, familiarity, and peace of mind (we won't cancel this test on you).

**DETAILS:**

- Test:** SAT test, without essay
- Cost:** \$52; Income eligible reduced fee: \$8 (See next page for details)
- Date/Time/Place:** March 3, 8 a.m. to 12 p.m., The Oaks
- Bring to test:** Two No. 2 pencils, calculator (may be graphing calculator), water, snacks
- Scores available:** March 19
- Practice:** Students can access free, personalized SAT practice at <https://www.khanacademy.org/sat>
- Registration deadline:** February 12, 2021. Please bring payment and registration form (below) to school office

**Juniors**, you are automatically registered to take this test as it is a graduation requirement. Please bring your \$52 test fee to the office by Feb. 12. (Juniors are welcome to take the test again during one of the national Saturday test sittings. For dates, go to: <https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/sat/register/dates-deadlines>)

**Seniors** who have not yet taken the SAT are required to participate in SAT School Day as a prerequisite for graduation. Seniors who have already taken the SAT are welcome to retake it, since many colleges accept a higher test score throughout the year for scholarship consideration.

**Sophomores** will not be permitted to miss classroom instruction to take the SAT test this year during the school day. Their participation will be mandatory during next year's SAT School Day.

1. The household size should be the number of household members including the filer on the family's current income tax statement. A student who is in foster care is considered a household size of one person.

Income levels are based on the USDA Food and Nutrition Service Income Eligibility Guidelines for free or reduced-price meals used by schools, institutions, and facilities participating in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP). ### More than six members in the household?

To determine income levels for families with more than six household members, take the annual allowance for six members, \$65,046, and add \$8,288 for each additional member.
